- 1. Describe the major aspects of the Louisiana Purchase?** Name the nations and groups that claimed land in western North America in 1800. Which president was responsible for the purchase and which country did he buy it from? Describe the geographic borders of the LA. Purchase. What group was sent to explore the new territory and what were four specific goals? Explain how the Louisiana Purchase and subsequent exploration impacted our nation's history. (A.J. pgs. 313-319)

- 2. Explain the causes and effects of the War of 1812.** Name some nations or groups that the young United States had conflicts with during the late 18th and early 19th centuries. What country did the U.S. fight in the War of 1812? Explain why the United States went to war. How were the Native Americans involved? Even though there was no real 'winner', describe what the U.S. gained from the war. What famous song was created during this war? (A.J. pgs. 341-345, 353-359)

- 3. Explain how the Monroe Doctrine showed new American pride and power.** What 2 continents did the Monroe Doctrine cover? What region and countries had recently gained freedom close to the U.S. and influenced the creation of the Monroe Doctrine? Who did the Monroe Doctrine tell to stay out of this area? How was the Doctrine a source of nationalism? Has the Monroe Doctrine always been used to help other nations? (A.J. pgs. 363-367)

- 4. Understanding the impact of the Industrial Revolution on the NATION.** Where and when did the Industrial Revolution begin? Which region of America was the first to develop industries? Explain why this region was first. Provide examples of how the Industrial Revolution changed each of the following: population, technology and transportation in America. What advantages did the U.S. have over other nations with regard to industry? Describe the changes that took place in how items were made. Describe the differences between the North and the South as a result of the Industrial Revolution. (A.J. pgs. 383-394)

- 5. Understanding the impact of the Industrial Revolution on American SOCIETY.** Explain the change in people's lives with regard to where and how they lived. Explain the differences between society in the North and the South. Explain the reasons certain groups were the primary factory workers in early America. Describe the role of immigration on the growth of America and industry, as well as changing attitudes towards immigrants. Explain how women's roles in society changed as a result of the Industrial Revolution. Describe the growing gap between rich and poor that develops during this time. Explain the growth of labor unions. Explain the impact of the Industrial Revolution on slavery. (A.J. pgs. 395-401, 408-413)
