- 4. Explain why Colonel Shaw was so hard on the private that was such a good shot.
- 5. Do you think Shaw made a wise decision when he ordered Trip to be whipped as a deserter (someone who leaves the army without permission)? Explain why or why not.
- 6. Describe Colonel Montgomery's (the leader of the contraband black unit) attitude about black soldiers. As a Union officer, why do you think he has these feelings?
- 7. What did Private Trip (Denzel Washington) mean when he told Colonel Shaw "I'm not fighting this war for you" and "ain't nobody gonna win"?
- 8. Why does Colonel Shaw volunteer the 54th to attack Fort Wagner? Why does Shaw tell the reporter to "remember what you see here today"?
- 9. **Do you feel that Colonel Shaw and the 54th Massachusetts accomplished any of their objectives? Explain why or why not.**
- 10. Explain the symbolism and significance of the final scene of the movie involving Colonel Shaw and Private Trip.
